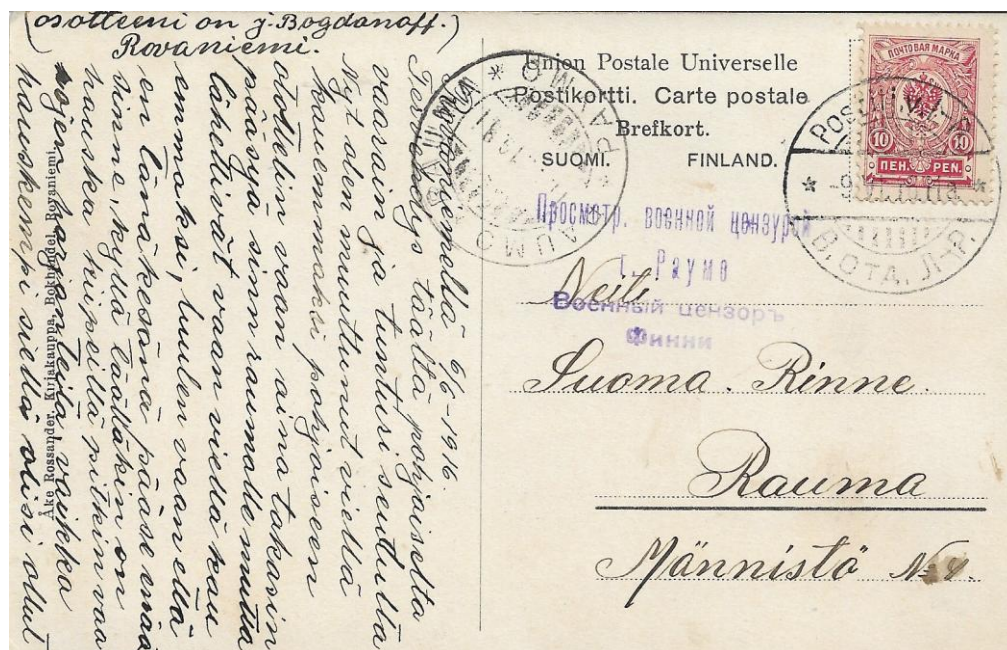


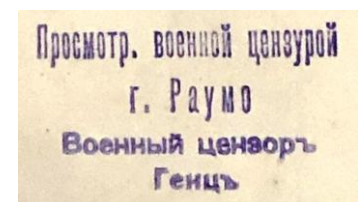
Rauma / Raumo / Раумо Censorship

Stamps and Resealing Tapes

25 October 1914 to 20 March 1917



This is a new Cs reported since last edition of this catalogue, Rauma Cs. No. 8.. Four versions have been found in the archives, of which only two of them have been reported in active use. Those two are Mark 2: Sensor Финни (Finni) shown above, and the left hand below Mark No. 1; Sensor Калониусъ (Kalonius). The use of the marks of sensor Клемковъ (Klemekov) and sensor Генць (Gents) have not yet been reported.

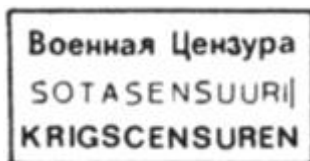

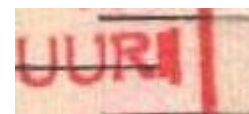

Comment:
 Stamp contains the same irregularity as Oulu Censor Stamp No. 1. There is a vertical line immediately after the letter "I" in the word "SOTASENSUURI."



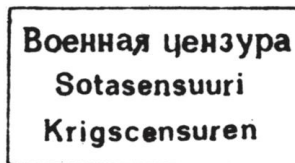
Mark appears solo on objects. Violet ink seen in May 1915. Termonen & Keturi measure this CS "19 x 35 mm." We believe this is a typographical error; the correct measurement is 19 x 37 mm.

Right: Domestic cover sent from Kortesjärvi 18 V 16, arriving Rauma next day, 19 V 1916 and marked with LKU of Cs 1. Late 1915 Rauma began to use violet ink.



Left: This is the EKV of Rauma CS No. 1 and the earliest recorded censor mark from Rauma, on a post card from Viipuri, 29. X. 1914. The censor office opened 25 October 1914, so it is still possible to find earlier censorship markings from this location.

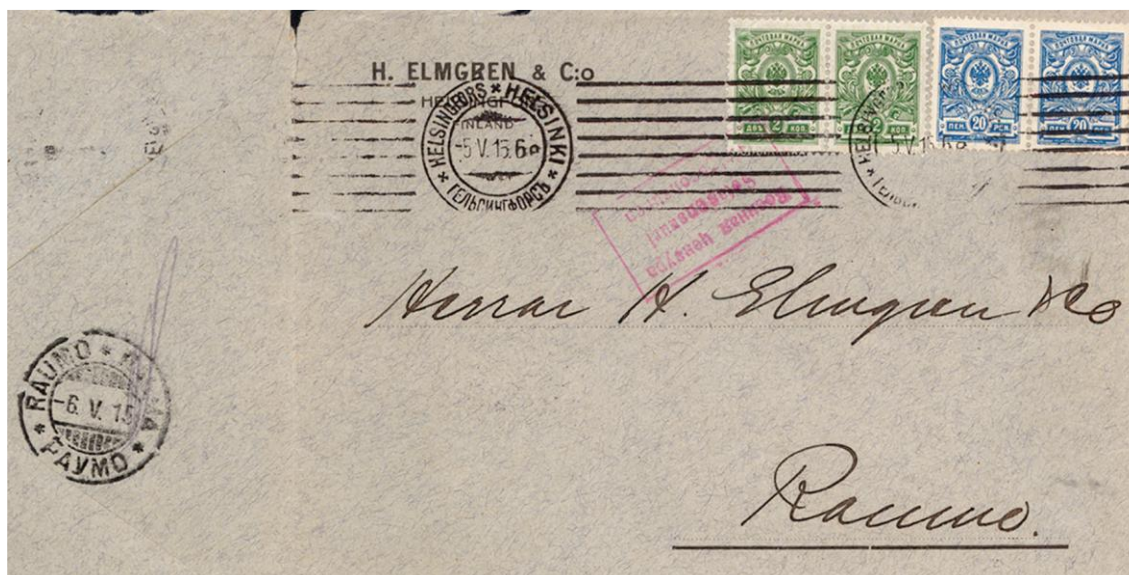

Comment:
 Mark generally distinct and usually appears in the right side, upper corner of an object. Two marks may have been in use as both color inks were used on the same day. Violet ink seen from April 1915.

This stamp is easily distinguished from CS No. 1 as the text in lines two and three are in sentence case whereas in CS No. 1, the second and third lines of text are in upper case.

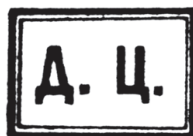
Rarity:
 Very common, level 1.



CS No. 2 is a very common Rauma mark struck on a double weight mixed franked cover from Helsinki, 5. V.15. The censor wrote his initials over the Rauma exit postmark, 6. V. 15. Handwritten initials or full personal signatures are very rare on passively censored covers; however, several are known from Rauma. It is noteworthy that and written censor initials are very infrequently seen after January 1915 except at Rauma and Kuopio. This cover has been reduced and cropped at the bottom.

The censor's initial is identified as Censor Initial No. 2.

 Violet ink was used from December 1915 to March 1916.
 It is most often seen solo on an object.

Rarity:
 Very common, level 1.

Right: Rauma CS No. 3 is a common general mark; similar marks were used in several censor locations, including Nikolainkaupunki and Kuopio. Sometimes it is difficult to ascertain the location where a cover has been inspected; however, procedures called for censorship at the destination location and mail addressed to Rauma was most certainly censored there unless the sender was a bank or other institution that arranged for censorship at the departure censor office. This cover was sent from Helsinki which did not use this type of mark.



Left: Local letter (Kokemäki lies within the Rauma censor office district) with a strong red strike of CS No. 3 showing the double frames very clearly.

Comment:

Occasionally, the censor has failed to sign his name. Specimens where the censor has added the name of the city "Rauma" have also been reported. Mark 1 is without a censor's signature. Six different censors' signatures are known, Mark Nos. 2-7. Distinguish from Nikolainkaupunki CS No. 10 by carefully measuring the height and length of the mark. Nikolainkaupunki CS measures 11 x 69 mm. Signatures also identify location. Seen with resealing tape.

Rarity:

All of these marks are very elusive, 4 or 5 except for Mark No. 3, which is ranked at level 3, common.

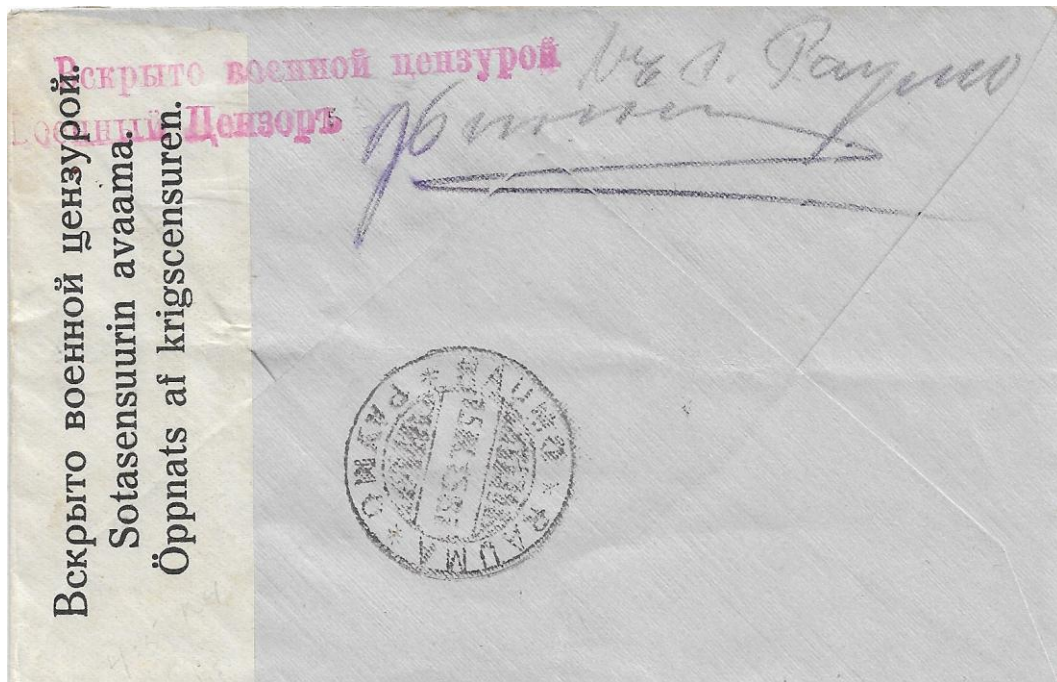

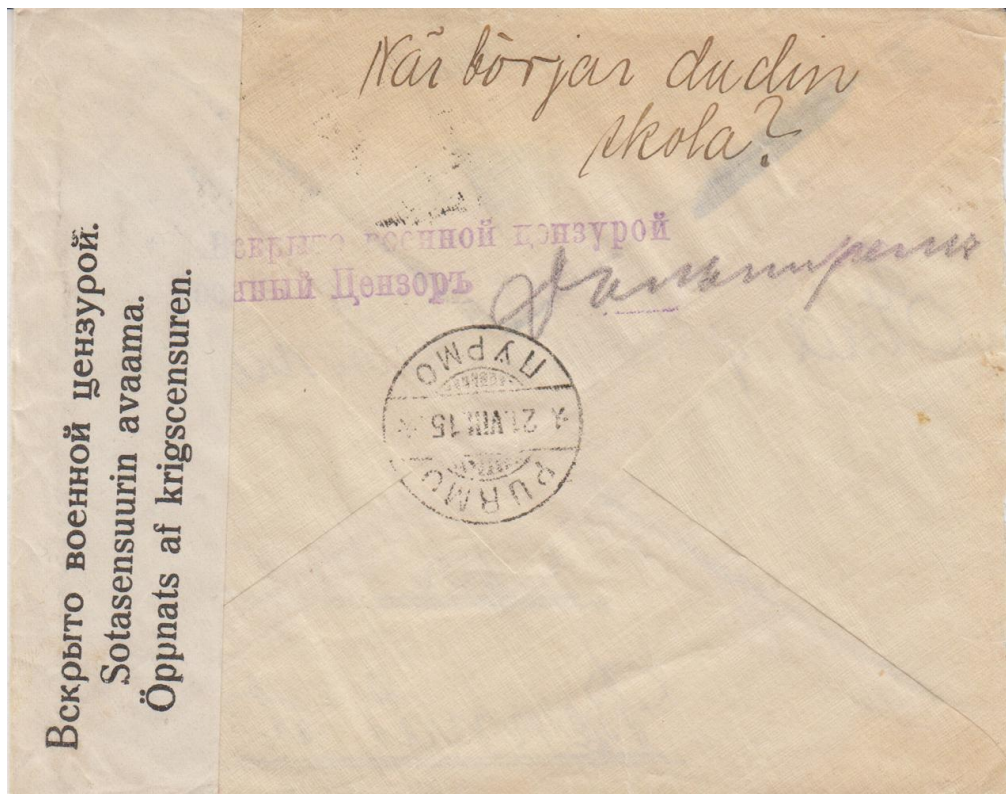

Rauma Censor Stamp No. 4, continued



These Rauma censor stamp marks are very elusive. This cover is postmarked KPXP No 11 15.IX.15 (used Helsinki-Pori railway line) and censored at Rauma same day signed with Mark No 5, and resealed with EKV of Censor Tape Type A used at Rauma from 15 Sep. 1915 to 18 Nov. 1916.



Mark 7 is newly reported on cover opened and resealed at Rauma, August 21, 1915. This is the only known example of this signature written under CS No. 4.

 Mark is generally partially indistinct, and usually stamped in the lower left corner of an object. At least two stamps were in use: Mark No. 1, all the letters are correctly aligned. In Mark No. 2, the serif on the letter "р" in the second Russian word is incomplete and bent forward.

Rarity:
 Both marks are common, level 2.

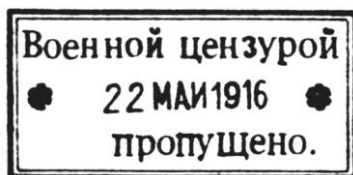

Right: This post card was sent from Kuunsankoski, 27. IX. 16, to Rauma, 28. IX. 16, inspected and approved, then struck with CS No. 5, CM 2, identified by the incomplete and bent serif in the letter "р" in the second Russian word.



Left: Both marks were in parallel use; towards the end of their service, the letters become somewhat worn and the impression is often blurred as seen on the last letter of the Russian text, "цензура" on the top line.

Comment:
 Originally, stamp may have been used as a censor ban mark. See Oulu CS No. 4 and Tampere CS No. 5. The Russian word, "He" on the third line of text was removed which would have changed the meaning to "passage allowed"

Rarity:
 Several examples of this censor stamp have been reported, but it is very difficult to find one. This CS is ranked 4 or (R) by T & K. As a class of censor marks, the most difficult are the marks denying the letter's return to the mail stream and delivery to the addressee.

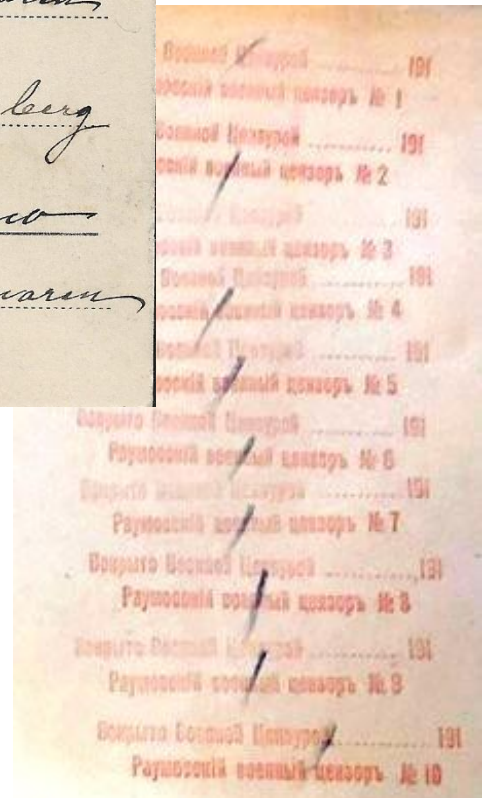

Above: Postcard sent from Hanko 28.X.1916 to Rauma 30.X.1916 with the very hard-to-find Cs.no. 7. This is Mark 5, which is one of only three out of ten, which have been reported used. 30 Oct. 1916 is EKU for any of the marks.

Comment:

This CS is not listed by Olamo or Termonen & Keturi. Mark No. 1 and No. 2 were first reported by Reijo Tanner, who also provided jpg scan of all 4 marks, found in the National Archives in Helsinki. At this stage there are no evidence of any active use of Mark No. 3 and 4.

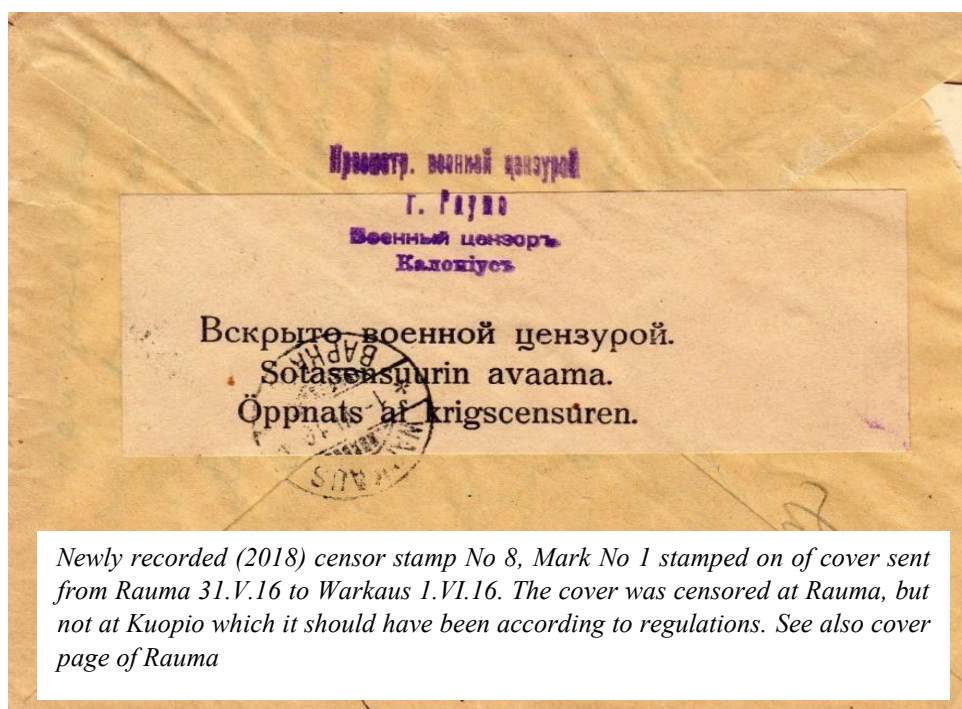

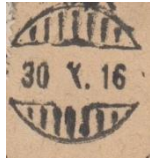

Newly recorded (2018) censor stamp No 8, Mark No 1 stamped on of cover sent from Rauma 31.V.16 to Warkaus 1.VI.16. The cover was censored at Rauma, but not at Kuopio which it should have been according to regulations. See also cover page of Rauma

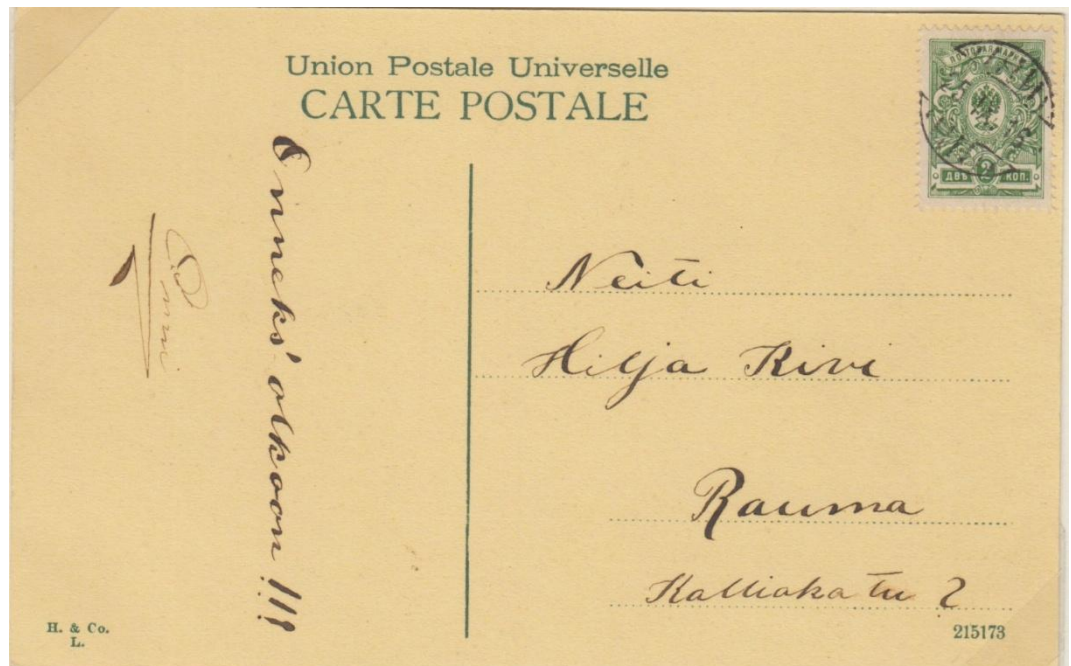

 Similar date stamp used at 4 other censor offices, but none of these are identical to this newly reported CS. Only two items are known, both shown here.

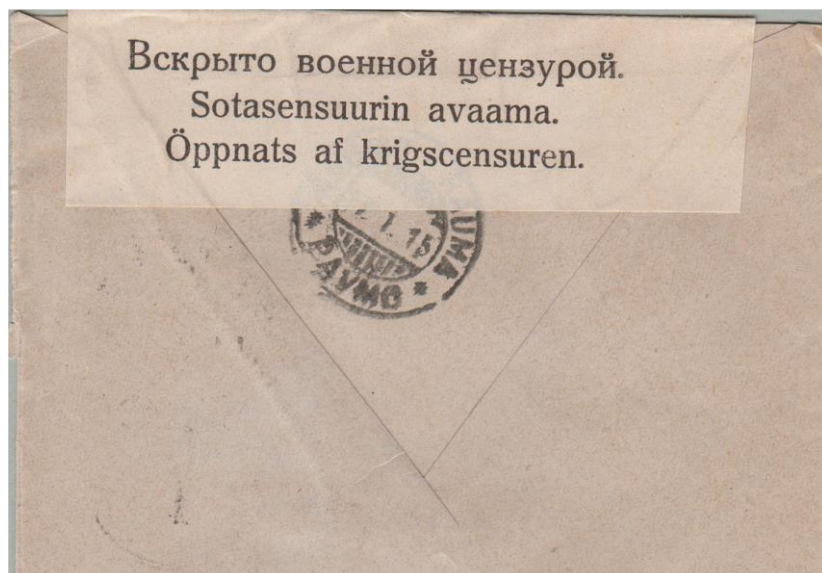
Refer to main text for differences between three subtypes. All three types are known used in Rauma.

Rarity:

Insufficient data to establish rarity levels for any of the five resealing tapes used at Rauma. Nevertheless, all Rauma resealing tapes are elusive and initialed covers are very rare.

Clearly the Type III white tapes are more plentiful considering length of time in service. Rarity is rated fairly common, level 3. The blue tapes are more elusive but cannot be assigned a ranking because census is unknown.

This Type A-III tape on a 17. I. 15 cover is the EKU of this tape on white paper. The white colored tape was introduced while the blue paper tapes were still in use.

Rauma Censor Initial No. 1

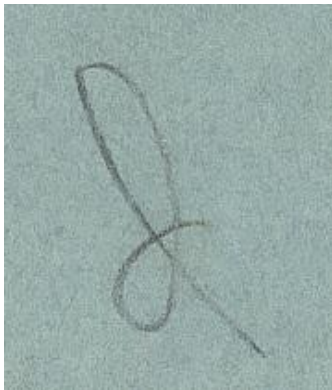
Initial No. 1 is seen on an opened and resealed cover inspected December 9, 1914. The censor's initial written in pencil on the bottom of the blue resealing tape, Type A-III. This marking suggests that other actively censored covers with the censor's initial or signature from Rauma may exist because the first personal censor stamps were not introduced at Rauma until March 1915.

Dates of Uses: 05 Dec. 1914 to 09 Dec. 1914

Rarity:

Uncertain, tentative level subject to reevaluation.

Rare, level 4 or R



*This is **Censor Initial No. 1**. The censor has written his initial on the tape; it is very faint, located at the bottom left. The Rauma exit cancel is dated, 9. XII. 14.*

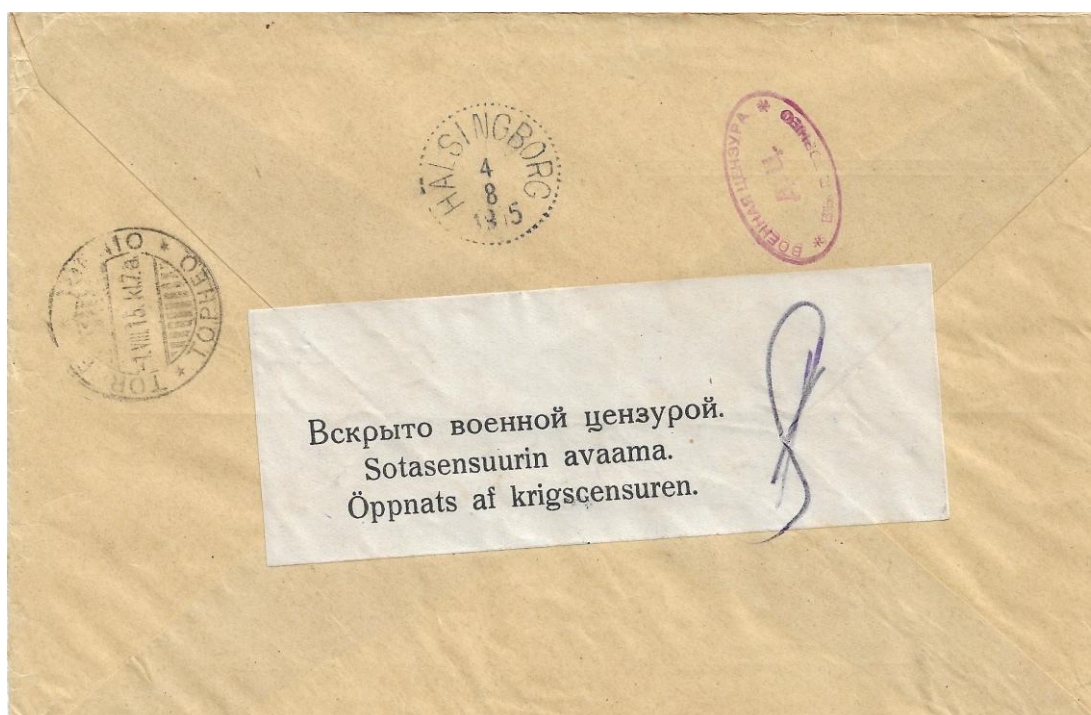

Rauma Censor Initial No. 2



Rauma Censor Initial No. 2. Front and back of a 4th weight cover (46-60 gr.) that was posted at Rauma 31.VII.15. and probably delivered unclosed to the post office, where after the censor office closed the cover with a white censor tape type AIII. There is a Rauma censor stamp type No. 3 on the front of the cover, which afterwards passed Tornio 1.VIII.15 and Tornio censor office for passive censorship, where it was marked with Tornio censor stamp No. 8 mark 1 (Earliest known use). Arrival postmark from Helsingborg 4.8.1915.

Rauma Censor Initial No. 3

Dates of Use: 20 Jun. 1915

Rarity: There is only one recorded copy.

The individual censors have not been identified.

It is a weak mark, but clearly different from the other initials reported at Rauma.

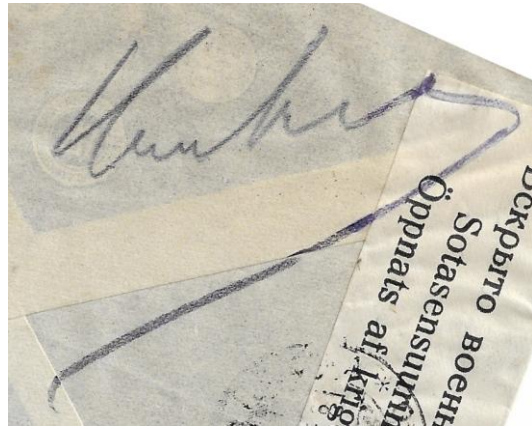

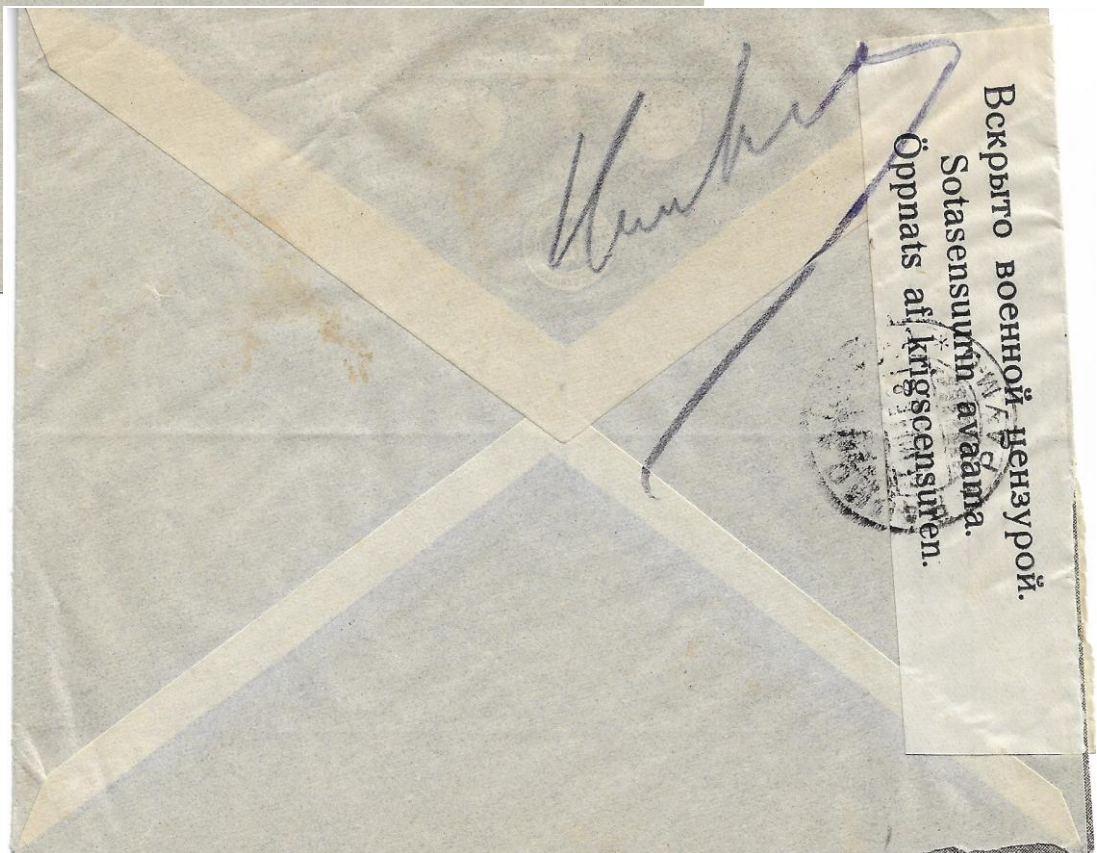

Rarity: There are three reported copies.



Rauma Censor Initial No. 5

This mark appears to have been written with two separate strokes, but the letters are uncertain and poorly defined. Given the difficulty in deciphering many of these initials and signatures, we surmise that the censor did not wish to have his identity known to the general public.

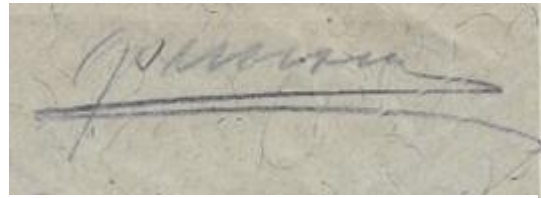
